Though Hollywood is home to many stars, it can be difficult to pick them out of a crowd. They travel in disguise and don't look like the characters they play on screen. In fact, half the time the only way to identify actors is by their voices. But use this map and you'll soon discover the only way to see the stars.



A. This 2002 autobiographical film is named for a road.

B. This film's high concept was "Bambi Meets Hamlet."

C. This was the last movie completed at the animation studio located inside the Disney World theme park.

D. The lead role in this film was reworked for a different actor and sport after Muhammed Ali backed out.

E. One scene in this 1994 movie is modeled on a scene in *Triumph of the Will*.

F. The producers of this film considered Harrison Ford and Mark Hamill for the lead, before settling on Alan Arkin.

G. This movie is the sequel to a short-lived TV series with a different name.

H. The Beatles agreed to play vultures in this 1967 movie, but they dropped out at the last minute.

I. One actress in this remake plays the mother of the character she played in the 1961 original.

J. For secrecy, this 2005 movie used two fake titles during production, "Paravel" and "The Hundred Year Winter."

K. This film taught us what a Quarter Pounder is called in Paris.

L. This 1998 feature launched the film career of its now-troubled young star.

M. This movie marked the first time a rap song won the Best Song Oscar.

N. The star of this hit comedy also co-wrote it... and it was his "first time" for that, too.

O. This is the only film of its type ever nominated for Best Picture.

P. This 2003 film features animal versions of Bob and Doug McKenzie.

Q. This 1978 movie's climax, a Superbowl, took place in real life with the same two teams just two years later.

S. This 2005 comedy had to leave 15 minutes of footage on the cutting-room floor to avoid an NC-17 rating.

T. To build word-of-mouth for this 2005 feature, the studio held over sixty previews before its release.

V. The *Lord of the Rings* trilogy and this other fantasy blockbuster showcased New Zealand's rugged terrain.

W. As a shortcut late in production, the ballroom dance in this 1991 film was copied from *Sleeping Beauty*.

Y. This film was the last production personally overseen by Walt Disney.
